## PRODUCTION SYSTEMS INVOLVING CITES-LISTED SPECIES AND THEIR IMPACT ON WILD POPULATIONS; DESIGNATION OF SOURCE CODES

- 1. This document has been prepared by the Secretariat.
- 2. This agenda item specifically addresses the allocation of source codes for specimens in trade that originate from different plant production systems for CITES reporting purposes. Plant production systems for CITES-listed plant species and their impact on wild populations are also considered under agenda item 15, and the background document prepared by the IUCN/SSC Wildlife Trade Programme that is annexed to document PC14 Doc. 15 should assist the Plants Committee with its discussions on the designation of source codes.
- 3. At present, the CITES source codes in use for plant and animal specimens as specified in Notification to the Parties No. 2002/022 of 9 April 2002 are:

Code	Description
W	Specimens taken from the wild
R	Specimens originating in a ranching operation
D	Appendix-I animals bred in captivity for commercial purposes and Appendix-I plants artificially propagated for commercial purposes, as well as parts and derivatives thereof, exported under the provisions of Article VII, paragraph 4 of the Convention
A	Plants that are artificially propagated in accordance with Resolution Conf. 11.11, paragraph a), as well as parts and derivatives thereof, exported under the provisions of Article VII, paragraph 5 of the Convention (specimens of species included in Appendix I that have been propagated artificially for non-commercial purposes and specimens of species included in Appendices II and III)
С	Animals bred in captivity in accordance with Resolution Conf. 10.16 (Rev.), as well as parts and derivatives thereof, exported under the provisions of Article VII, paragraph 5 of the Convention (specimens of species included in Appendix I that have been bred in captivity for non-commercial purposes and specimens of species included in Appendices II and III)
F	Animals born in captivity (F1 or subsequent generations) that do not fulfil the definition of 'bred in captivity' in Resolution Conf. 10.16 (Rev.), as well as parts and derivatives thereof
0	Pre-Convention specimens (may be used with another code)
U	Source unknown (must be justified)
I	Confiscated or seized specimens (may be used with another code)

4. The Plants Committee may wish to consider forming a technical working group to consider whether additional source codes for plants are required taking into account the information presented in the document prepared by the IUCN/SSC Wildlife Trade Programme.
