IDENTIFICATION MANUAL

- 1. This document has been prepared by the Secretariat.
- 2. In accordance with Resolution Conf. 11.19, paragraph g), the Secretariat herewith provides a report on the progress made with the production of the Identification Manual.
- 3. The process of converting all published sheets into electronic format is ongoing. Approximately 1800 sheets remain to be scanned and included in the database. All new sheets and translations are prepared in electronic format, and converted in PDF format. The intention is to make all sheets available from the website and to have these linked to the species database.
- 4. The Secretariat would like to remind Parties that have successfully submitted proposals to include new species in the Appendices that they are exhorted to provide appropriate data for inclusion in the Identification Manual (see Resolution Conf. 11.19).
- 5. Switzerland has produced sheets for the freshwater turtles that were included in the Appendices at the twelfth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (Santiago, November 2002). Sheets have been prepared for the following species and the Secretariat will shortly print and distribute these to the Parties:

7. The United States of America has informed the Secretariat that it is completing a sheet on *Polyodon spathula*.

8. The Secretariat has received funding from the Netherlands to contribute to the production of the next CITES Identification Guide to be produced by Environment Canada (on amphibians), and for the preparation of sheets on the following species:
