Financing and Budgeting of the Secretariat and of Meetings of the Conference of the Parties

BUDGET FOR 1986-1987 AND MEDIUM TERM PLAN FOR 1986-1989

- 1. In accordance with paragraphs 5 and 6 of the Terms of Reference for the Administration of the Trust Fund for the Convention, adopted by Resolution Conf. 4.3 at the fourth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (Gaborone, 1983, Proceedings, page 41), the Secretariat has prepared the 1986-87 budget estimate attached hereto, together with two draft scales of contributions (Annexes 2, 3 and 4). In accordance with paragraph 6 of the Terms of Reference, the Secretariat has also prepared a medium term plan covering 1986-89 inclusive which incorporates the budget for the 1986-87 financial period (Annex 5). The Secretariat has also prepared an estimate of the expenditure for 1985 (Annex 1).
- 2. The proposed 1986-87 budget differs from previous budgets presented to the Parties mainly because of the new structure of the Secretariat. New headings such as "premises" and "communications" (which used to be part of "sundries"), have been inserted to provide for a more accurate picture of the financial provisions.
- 3. The budget, as presented to the Parties, reflects the requirements for "minimum expenditure". No provisions have been made for shortfall in contributions.
- 4. It must be realized, however, that this very restrictive approach places a heavy burden on the workload of the Secretariat. Programmes such as consultants and part time translations have been reduced. This means that the Secretariat will have to address itself to related activities such as translation in the 3 working languages (English, French and Spanish) of regular correspondence, notifications and other documentation, public information, technical assistance to the Parties, organization of the Conference and committee meetings, etc.
- 5. The Secretariat submits to the attention of the Parties two scales of contributions:
 - a) the first (Annex 3) is based on the applicable United Nations scale, as adopted by the UN General Assembly in December 1982 and has been applied to the total budget figure for the biennium 1986-87, i.e. US\$ 1,520,359. However, considering that our membership falls short of the UN membership by 9.41% (90.59% compared to 100%), this creates a

shortfall in the income, by comparison to the budget of US\$ 142,929.00 for the biennium (total income under that scale would be US\$ 1,377,430). This shortfall cannot in any manner be covered by other expected sources of income.

- b) for the second scale of contributions (Annex 4), the Secretariat has added 9.41% to the total budget for 1986-87 to reach the figure of US\$ 1,520,410.00. The UN scale of contributions was applied to that amount.
- c) the UN General Assembly decided to maintain for 1985 the present scale of contributions until such time as the Contribution Committee had completed its study of the proposed scale of contributions and had submitted its findings to the General Assembly for review and decision. It is therefore recommended that the scale of contributions which will be adopted by the Parties be amended, as soon as the UN General Assembly has adopted its new scale of contributions for 1986, 1987 and 1988 and that the Parties be immediately notified of such amendment by the Secretariat.

The Secretariat recommends that the second scale of contributions (Annex 4) be adopted.

- 6. The budget also takes into account the programme support costs which are provided for in respect of all Trust Fund activities under applicable United Nations regulations [UNEP statement at the 1979 San José meeting, Plen. 2.7 (Rev.), Proceedings, page 106]. The estimate does not include projects submitted or to be submitted for separate external funding to UNEP (pursuant to section 4 of UNEP Governing Council decision 6/5 D, Nairobi, 1978) or other funding institutions, in accordance with Resolution Conf. 2.3 (San José, 1979).
- 7. With respect to the Terms of Reference for the Administration of the Trust Fund (Annex 6), some minor modifications have been made to reflect the new structure of the Secretariat.
- 8. In the absence of any UNEP contributions and of capital reserve for the Convention, financing of the Secretariat and of the Conference depends entirely on regular contributions by Parties. It is most alarming, therefore, to note that by the end of the fourth year of operation of the Trust Fund, 30% of the government contributions (more than US\$ 400,000) were in arrears. Parties are urged to pay their outstanding contributions as soon as possible and to make the necessary advance provision in their national budgets for future annual or biennial contributions as outlined in the scale which will be adopted by the Parties.

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TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE TRUST FUND FOR THE CONVENTION ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN ENDANGERED SPECIES OF WILD FAUNA AND FLORA

- 1. The Trust Fund for the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (hereinafter referred to as the Trust Fund) shall be continued for a period of two years to provide financial support for the aims of the Convention.
- 2. Pursuant to the Financial Regulations and Rules of the United Nations, the Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), with the approval of the Governing Council, shall continue the Trust Fund for the administration of the Convention.
- 3. The financial period shall be for two calendar years beginning 1 January 1986, and ending 31 December 1987. The appropriations of the Trust Fund for the financial period shall be financed from:
 - a) the contributions made by the Parties by reference to Table 1*, including contributions from any new Parties which are to be added to Table 1*;
 - b) contributions from states not Party to the Convention, other governmental, inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations and other sources; and
 - c) any uncommitted appropriations from the 1984-1985 financial period.
- 4. The budget estimates covering the income and expenditure for each of the two calendar years constituting the financial period to which they relate, prepared in US dollars, shall be submitted to the regular meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention.
- 5. The estimates of each of the calendar years covered by the financial period shall be divided into sections and chapters; shall be specified according to budget lines; shall include references to the programmes of work to which they relate; and shall be accompanied by such information as may be required by, or on behalf of, the contributors, and such further information as the Executive Director of UNEP may deem useful and advisable. In particular, estimates shall also be prepared for each programme of work for each of the calendar years, with expenditure itemized for each programme so as to correspond to the sections, chapters, and budget lines described in the first sentence of this paragraph. The sum of the programme estimates shall equal the sum of the estimates described in the first paragraph.
- 6. In addition to the budget estimates for the financial period described in the preceding paragraphs, the Secretary General of the Convention, in consultation with the Standing Committee and the Executive Director of

UNEP, shall prepare a medium term plan as envisaged in Chapter III of Legislative and Financial Texts Regarding The United Nations Environment Programme and the Environment Fund. The medium term plan will cover the years 1986-1989, inclusive, and will incorporate the budget for the 1986-1987 financial period.

- 7. The proposed budget and medium term plan shall be dispatched by the Secretariat to all Parties at least ninety days before the date fixed for the opening of the regular meeting of the Conference of the Parties.
- 8. The budget and medium term plan shall be adopted by a 3/4 majority of the Parties present and voting at the regular meeting.
- 9. In the event that the Executive Director of UNEP anticipates that there might be a shortfall in resources, over the year as a whole, he shall consult with the Secretary General, who shall seek the advice of the Standing Committee as to its priorities for expenditure.
- 10. Upon the request of the Secretary General, after seeking the advice of the Standing Committee, the Executive Director of UNEP should, to the extent consistent with the Financial Regulations and Rules of the United Nations, make transfers from one budget line to another. At the end of the first calendar year of a financial period, the Executive Director of UNEP may proceed to transfer any uncommitted balance of appropriations to the second calendar year, provided that the total budget approved by the Parties shall not be exceeded unless this is specifically sanctioned in writing by the Standing Committee.
- 11. All contributions shall be paid in convertible currencies. Contributions from states that become Parties after the beginning of the financial period should be made on a pro-rata basis for the balance of the financial period.
- 12. At the end of each calendar year of a financial period, the Executive Director of UNEP shall submit to the Parties the accounts for the year. He shall also submit, as soon as practicable, the audited accounts for the financial period.
- 13. Those financial reports now required to be submitted to the Executive Director of UNEP shall be transmitted simultaneously by the Secretary General of the Convention to members of the Standing Committee.
- 14. The Secretary General of the Convention shall provide the Standing Committee with an estimate of proposed expenditure over the coming quarter simultaneously with, or as soon as possible after, distribution of the accounts and reports referred to in the preceding paragraphs.
- 15. The general procedures governing the operations of the Fund of UNEP and the Financial Regulations and Rules of the United Nations shall govern the financial operations of the Trust Fund for the Convention.
- 16. These Terms of Reference shall be effective for the financial period of 1 January 1986 to 31 December 1987.
