IDENTIFICATION MANUAL COMMITTEE

1. Terms of Reference and Membership

- 1.1 At the fifth regular meeting, the Conference of the Parties decided to extend the mandate of the Identification Manual Committee up to the sixth meeting (Resolution Conf. 5.17). The Conference invited:
 - a) the Parties to submit in consultation with the Committee appropriate contributions for existing listings in the appendices, expecially with regard to flora;
 - b) the Parties that propose additions to the appendices to provide appropriate data for inclusion in the Identification Manual within one year after acceptance of such additions; and
 - c) the French or Spanish speaking Parties to contribute to the translation of the Identification Manual.
- 1.2 The Committee is chaired by Switzerland. Current members are experts nominated by the following Parties: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Denmark, France, Federal Republic of Germany, Guatemala, India, Switzerland, United Kingdom, United States of America and Uruguay.

2. Work of the Committee

Some of the members of the Committee met during the TEC meeting held at Lausanne from 23 to 27 June 1986. Information circulars were sent out by the Chairman to the Committee members on 11 June 1985, 23 August 1985, 3 December 1985, 11 March 1986, 18 April 1986, 25 April 1986, 3 June 1986, 4 November 1986 and 31 March 1987. The remaining work was done by individual correspondence or by personal contacts.

On 31 October 1985 and 28 October 1986 the Chairman submitted interim reports to the Standing Committee.

3.4 Each Party received one set of binders of the Flora part (Volumes 1, 2, 3) and a copy of all chapters and sections produced during the reporting period. Parties having paid their contributions to the CITES Trust Fund received six more complete sets free of charge upon request (see Notifications of the Secretariat Nos. 352, 369, 383, 399, 410, 411).

Only 22 Parties made full use of their quota of seven free of charge copies (AT, CA, CH, CL, CY, DE, EC, GT, IN, IT, LI, MY, NL, NO, PA, PG, PK, SE, TN, UK/HK, US, ZA), whereas the Netherlands ordered an additional 22 and the United States an additional 38 copies. Among the 54 Parties receiving only one copy the number of English speaking countries having paid their contributions was surprisingly high. Around 80 copies have been ordered by organizations, firms or private individuals.

Because of the continuing fluctuation in the rate of exchange of the US dollar towards the Swiss franc, a price list in Swiss francs has been established for the sale of surplus copies of the Manual (see Notification of the Secretariat No. 429):

^{4.3} Counterpart contributions under Resolutions Conf. 3.18, 4.19 and 5.17

By Resolutions Conf. 3.18, 4.19 and 5.17, the Conference of the Parties invited the Parties that proposed additions to the appendices to provide appropriate data for inclusion in the Identification Manual within one year after acceptance of such additions.

In the report given to the Conference at the Gaborone meeting, it was stated that response to this invitation was rather weak, and four Parties were invited again to submit contributions pursuant to Resolution Conf. 3.18. Regarding the amendments adopted at the fourth meeting, there was no response from three Parties, and regarding

those adopted at the fifth meeting, also three Parties did not respond to a letter sent to them by the Committee Chairman on 17 May 1985.

In the meantime, data sheets on some of the species concerned have been prepared by other Parties than the proponents, but in some cases contributions would still be needed:

Translations

Canada started to translate the entire Manual from English into French. The first and a part of the second volume of the French translation are in print.

With financial aid from EEC (54,000.- ECU), the Secretariat started to translate the Manual into Spanish.

A Japanese version of the Manual in three binders has been produced and published by the Scientific Authority of Japan in November 1986.

A German version of the Manual, two large binders so far, has been edited by the Scientific Authority of the Federal Republic of Germany. This edition is available from the publisher Daemisch-Mohr.

6. Staff Matters

As in previous years, the editorial work was done gratuitously by the Management Authority of Switzerland. The Secretariat continued to provide a part-time secretary (20%) to the Chairman of the Identification Manual Committee. In addition, during most of 1986, the Secretariat employed a biologist for the editing of the French version of the Manual with financial aid from UNEP.

7. Financial Matters

7.1 UNEP Project

See the Annex to the present document.

7.2 Funding from NGOs

The German Fur Trade Association/Artenschutzkreis des Kürschner-handwerks sponsored the colour printing of the chapters on Primates, Canidae, Lutrinae, Viverridae, Pinnipedia and Camelidae Fur Skins with SFr. 20,000. - which covered around one third of the actual costs.

World Wildlife Fund Switzerland sponsored part of the artwork of the Varanidae chapter by a direct payment to the artist of SFr. 5,900.-. World Wildlife Fund also agreed to sponsor the artwork of the Birds of Paradise chapter which will cost about SFr. 13,200.-.

World Wildlife Fund US sponsored the artwork of the Appendix I Neotropical Primates poster by direct payment to the artist.

The New York Zoological Society sponsored the artwork of the Amazon Parrot poster by direct payment to the artist.

The SFr. 16,392.- available in the Chairman's account on 1 January 1985 consisted of funds allocated to the production of data sheets on Island Fauna by World Wildlife Fund Switzerland, plus interest. the Australian SFr. 555.- were paid to Management Authority (a.c. Varanidae chapter). It was agreed with the Secretary General remaining funds the should not be transferred to Secretariat's account in order to cover the printing costs of the chamaeleon and birdwing butterflies chapters, but that it should be used for the payment of the part-time secretary in 1987.

- (a) To reflect the actual 1986 expenditures under the CITES Trust Fund, increasing the 1986 costs by \$23,823 occasioned by the rise in the exchange value of the Swiss France in terms of the U.S. dollar.
- (b) To increase the 1987 costs to the CITES Trust Fund by \$135,155 to provide \$33,055 partially for the temporary administrative assistance required for the 6th meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the CITES in July, Ottawa, Canada, additional \$4,350 to adjust the costs of General Service staff salary and additional \$97,750 for 4 months costs of 4 professional staff covering through 31 July 1987.
- (c) To increase the total project costs to the Trust Fund by \$158,978 in view of (a) and (b) above.
- (d) To reflect the actual 1986 expenditures under the Environment Fund under budget line 6105 rephasing an unspent balance of \$8,945 to 1987 for additional production costs of the Identification Manual (French version).
- (e) To provide \$105,875 in 1987 under the Fund Programme Reserve to cover 6 months costs of one professional staff member and the costs of the 6th meeting of the Conference of the Contracting Parties, July, Ottawa as follows:

line 1100: Experts:

\$23,930 for 6 months costs for one professional staff member normally financed through counterpart funds provided by the Japan General Merchandise Importers Association

line 1300: Administrative :

\$31,945 for the temporary assistance

required for the meeting of the

Conference of the Contracting Parties.

line 1600: Travel on :

official business:

\$20,000 for the staff travel in

connection with the meeting.

line 5200: Reporting costs:

\$10,000 to produce a demonstration "CITES News" for the meeting of the Parties to see before making a decision on future funding from the CITES Trust Fund.

line 5300: Miscellaneous:

\$20,000 for communications and other

miscellaneous costs.

The above costs will be reversed to the CITES Trust Fund when there are enough funds to cover them. This is an interim arrangement made due to the insufficient funds in the Trust Fund.

- (f) To reflect the actual 1986 expenditures under sub-project <u>CP/6105-84-61 Ivory Co-ordination Unit</u>, increasing the 1986 costs by \$1,844 and providing \$4,466 in 1987 for post 1101 Ivory Co-ordinator. The total costs are increased by \$6,310.
- (g) To reflect the actual 1986 expenditures under sub-project, <u>CP/6105-84-62</u>
 Special Project Unit, increasing the 1986 costs by \$769 which is transferred from 1987, retaining the total costs at \$50,000.
- (h) To reflect the actual 1986 expenditures under sub-project, <u>CP/6105-84-64</u>
 <u>Caiman Latin America Project</u>, increasing the 1986 costs by \$775 which is transferred from 1987, reducing the total costs by \$13,834 to reflect the estimated needs.
- (i) To reflect the 1986 expenditures under sub-project <u>CP/6105-84-66</u> <u>Identification Manual</u>, increasing the 1986 and 1987 costs by \$1,406 and \$3,953 respectively. The total costs are increased by \$5,359.
- (j) To reflect the actual 1986 expenditures under sub-project <u>CP/6105-84-67 Status of all Filidae in Bolivia</u>, increasing the 1986 and total costs by \$294.
- (k) To reflect the actual 1986 expenditures under <u>CP/6105-84-68 Status of</u> and the Trade in Green Turtles, rephasing \$22 to 1987, retaining the total costs at \$80,000.
