NOTIFICATION TO THE PARTIES

CONCERNING:	

Caviar trade database

- Parties are reminded that a caviar trade database has been developed by UNEP-WCMC for their use. The
 purpose of the database is to record near-real-time information relating to exports and re-exports of caviar.
 The database enables monitoring of caviar in trade and assists in the verification of the authenticity and
 validity of permits and certificates. Caviar permit data have been regularly entered into the caviar database
 by UNEP-WCMC since 2007.
- 2. The database has recently been re-developed with support from the European Commission. Parties may now query permit details either through a permit number search, or by selecting various parameters (e.g. species, source code, exporter, importer and year). The results display individual permit details, as well as the details of any previous or subsequent (re-)export permit, which can be accessed through hyperlinks. An example of a permit search is annexed to this Notification.
- Additional tools are available to check whether range States are complying with published export quotas, or detect where Parties have apparently re-exported quantities that are greater than the quantities originally imported.
- 4. In Resolution Conf. 12.7 (Rev. CoP14) (Conservation of and trade in sturgeons and paddlefish), the Conference of the Parties recommends that Parties consult the database before issuing re-export certificates.
- 5. To be effective, it is essential that all Parties that issue permits and certificates authorizing trade in caviar submit to UNEP-WCMC copies of such documents or information regarding each permit issued, so that the information may be entered into the database. Parties are encouraged to submit such copies no later than one month after the date of issuance. It is recommended that permits and certificates be scanned and sent by email to UNEP-WCMC at caviar@unep-wcmc.org. Alternatively, copies may be faxed to: +44 (1223) 27 71 36.
- 6. In order for the caviar database to reflect trade as accurately as possible, it is recommended that Parties notify UNEP-WCMC of any caviar permits that are cancelled or returned unused to the Management Authorities. It is also recommended that Parties notify UNEP-WCMC when the quantity actually exported or re-exported differs from the quantity indicated on the permit issued, so that the data may be amended accordingly.
- 7. To ensure an appropriate level of confidentiality, access to the online database is password-protected and possible only through links in the Management Authorities forum and Enforcement Authorities forum of the CITES website. Applications to access these forums should be submitted through the Resources/Forum section of the CITES website.
- 8. This Notification replaces Notification to the Parties No. 2009/008 of 6 March 2009.

Example of a permit search on the caviar database

Permits can be searched either by entering the permit number or by selecting from the Advanced Search Options (Figure 1). Both ways provide search results that include information on the countries involved in the trade, the species in trade, the date of issue of the permit, and the quantity and source of the caviar (Figure 2). Details on re-exports can be seen by clicking on "Re-Exports Details" (Figure 3).
