The Act has imposed domestic trade bans on rhinoceros and tigers and their parts and derivatives such as TCM products. The revised ESA also allows AVA to take enforcement actions and impose the same penalties for cases involving fake CITES specimens ie. which are purported to be of CITES species but are fakes.
