ANNEX 1

C2: Administrative measures (e.g., fines, bans, suspensions) imposed for CITES-related violations

During 2010 a fine of a total sum of 70 850 BGN (appr. 36 225. 03 EUR) and confiscation of specimens were Imposed:

- 1. A fine of a fine of 70 200 BGN (appr. 35 872. 70 EUR) to Bulgarian citizen with Lebanon origin, for his attempt to import 108 Grey Parrots in Bulgaria, respectively EU. The offence was detected by the Customs Border Control of Sofia Airport on 22 April 2010. The shipment was without any CITES import permits allowing the import into EU or other CITES parties and the transport conditions had not been met.
- 2. A fine of 650 BGN (appr. 332.34 EUR) was imposed to Bulgarian citizen for keeping of two unregistered specimens of Green Iguana and Grey Parrot. The specimens had been offered for sale thru internet. They were seized after the inspection made by the Regional Inspectorate of Environment and Water in Sofia. No documentation for origin for these specimens had been provided to the Enforcement Authority.

#### C5: Significant seizures/confiscations

During the period specimens had been seized or confiscated:

- a) 108 specimens of Psittacus erithacus seized end confiscated;
- b) 2 specimens of Hieraaetus fasciatus seized;
- c) 4 specimens of Crocodylus niloticus Cites App. I originated from Sudan seized on 10.12.2008 /confiscated in 2009;
- d) 1 specimen of Iguana iguana confiscated;
- e) 1 specimen of Psittacus erithacus confiscated
- (f) 39 items LPS made from Crocodilian leather seized;
- (g) 43 item made from ivory seized.

#### C7: Criminal prosecutions of significant CITES-related violations

On 27.03.2010 a mobile group of customs officers at Port Vidin stopped a Bulgarian citizen exporting from Bulgaria two specimens of *Hieraaetus fasciatus*. During the documentary check he present to the four false certificates for the birds.

These birds are not registered in the relevant Regional Inspectorates of Environment and Water in accordance to the current national legislation. No documents allowing trade or transport across the EU had been issued by the Ministry of Environment and Water.

The criminal prosecution against the offender for the use of false documentation for transaction and possession of protected species without permits is on-going.

Places of introduction and export designated by Member States for Trade with third countries in accordance with Article VIII (3) of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of wild Fauna and Flora and referred to in Article 12 of Council Regulation (EC)  $N^{\circ}$  338/97 of 9 December 1996, on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein.
