Annex I - C5

According to the information reported by the Ministry of Finance, in 2009 Customs Service carried out 253 seizures consisting of 26380 CITES specimens, including: 1020 live animals (211 tortoises, 800 medicinal leeches, 8 parrots, 1 specimen of *Brachypelma* spp.), 227 specimens of Traditional Asian Medicine, 3 live plants (*Opuntia* spp.), 25000 specimens of frozen *Anguilla anguilla*, 10 kg of caviar, 174 kg of corals (*Scleractinia* spp.) and 13 ivory carvings. In 2010 Customs Service carried out 193 seizures consisting of 8495 specimens, including: 30 live animals (3 *Caracal caracal*, 1 *Leptailurus serval*, 26 parrots), 8286 tablets of TAM, 5 kg of *Hoodia gordonii* powder, 70 kg of frozen *Anguilla anguilla* and 352 kg of corals (*Scleractinia* spp.).

Annex II - C6, C7, C8, C9

Violations of the CITES provisions (included in national and EU law) are subject to sanctions such as penalty of detention or fine (for offences) and sentence of imprisonment from 3 months up to 5 years (for crimes).

In accordance with the Nature Conservation Act of 16 April 2004 the following actions are considered as offences:

- not declaring possession of live amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals of species covered by EU regulations on wildlife trade (CITES species) violation of registration obligation;
- not possessing and not providing to the buyer documents on legal origin of the animal which is being sold (this obligation applies to sellers and other persons carrying out an economic activity related to wildlife trade).

According to mentioned Act the following actions, among others, are considered as crimes:

- transporting and border-crossing with CITES specimens without necessary permits,
- not presenting the import notification at the border Customs office (obligation concerns Annex C and D specimens of EU wildlife trade regulations),
- using specimens of CITES species for the purpose different then the one indicated in the permit or certificate,
- carrying out commercial activities involving CITES specimens without appropriate documents stating their legal acquisition (origin) and without fulfilment of conditions provided in CITES related regulations.

The most frequent violation concerning endangered species of fauna and flora, identified in the reporting period, is border-crossing without necessary permits and offering for sale without sufficient documents of legal origin and acquisition.

Sentences in the majority of court cases imposed fines and forfeitures of seized specimens. So far, the most severe penalty of imprisonment (from 3 months up to 5 years) has not been imposed (there were cases where it was applied only in suspension). There were also cases where courts also imposed on the convicts obligation of work for the public purposes.

Furthermore, people who were convicted (penalized) for the infringement of provisions regarding wildlife trade can be refused by CITES Management Authority to obtain a CITES permit within the period of 3 years from the date of conviction (art. 61 p. 7 of the Nature Conservation Act of 16 April 2004). There was no such case in the reporting period.

According to information reported by the National Police HQs in 2009 Police initiated 449 cases connected with CITES violations, of which 147 finished with an indictment. In 2010 initiated cases amounted 190, of which 57 cases finished with an indictment.

Annex III - D6 Capacity building activities
