Veľké lastúry (ako napríklad krídlatec veľký) a obrovské mušle sú veľmi populárne suveníry. Obrovské mušle na obchodné účely sa môžu dovážať len na zvláštne povolenie na dovoz. Na osobné účely je možné dovážať iba tri kusy.



Tradičná čínska medicína

Tieto liečivá môžu obsahovať časti chránených druhov zvierat, ako napríklad z tigrov, nosorožcov a leopardov. Okrem toho tieto liečivá môžu byť nebezpečné pre vaše zdravie.



Cestovná brožúrka pre lovcov suvenírov

Želáte si zažiť vynikajúcu dovolenku a dúfate, že budete mať príjemný pobyt? Vašu batožinu budú prezerať colníci. Nebudete mať žiadny problém, za predpokladu, ak nebudete kupovať nijaké zakázané výrobky. A nejaký pekný suvenír? Áno, je to možné, a potom sa neobávajte, že colníci vám budú robiť problém...

A predsa... Každý rok prichádza na Slovensko a do EÚ nelegálne množstvo chránených živočíchov, rastlín a ich produktov, ako sú kožušiny, kaviár či umelecké výrobky. Organizovaný zločin? Niekedy áno. Veľmi často sú to nevedomí turisti, ktorí si takéto výrobky prinášajú domov ako suvenír. Takýto horúčkovitý nákup má potom nepríjemné následky. Predovšetkým, obchod s takýmito výrobkami je zhubný pre množstvo chránených zvierat a rastlín. Samozrejme musíte od colníkov očakávať zaistenie takýchto suvenírov. A niekedy vám hrozí vysoká pokuta alebo dokonca aj väzeni



Riziká spojené s nelegálne nakúpenými suvenírmi

- » vaše suveníry vám colníci zabavia,
- » potrestajú vás pokutou,
 » môžete ohroziť prežitie ohrozených druhov vo voľnej prírode.

Dobre si to rozmyslite, kým kúpite suvenír wyrobený z prírodného materiálu a v prípade akýchkoľvek pochybností: **Nekupujte hol**

Zostaňte v strehu pred nelegálnymi suvenírmi, to však neznamená, že sa všetkým obchodom so suvenírmi musíte na dovolenke vyhýbať. Vôbec nie, množstvo na predaj ponúkaných výrobkov nepredstavuje žiadne riziko. V mnohých krajinách je výroba suvenírov aj významným príjmom pre miestne obyvateľstvo. Neváhajte preto a kúpte si pekný suvenír, predtým si však, zistite či je to úplne v poriadku


V dôsledku pytliactva obyvateľov Afriky poklesol stav nosorožcov o 95%. Ale prichádzajú dobré správy, že tento stav sa mení. Je to aj zásluhou CITES (Dohovor o medzinárodnom obchode s ohrozenými druhmi zvierat a rastlín). Tento dohovor medzi 173 štátmi reguluje obchod s ohrozenými druhmi divo žijúcich zvierat a rastlín. Koraly

Približne až jeden milión druhov koralov potrebuje žiť na koralových útesoch. Avšak veľa ohrozených druhov koralov je často používaných na výrobu šperkov a na ozdobu. Koraly sa hlavne vyskytujú na austrálskom pobreží a v krajinách pri Indickom oceáne a v Červenom mori. Zaujímavé je, že koraly sú vytvorené živočíchmi. Keď koraly pomaly odumierajú vytvárajú sa rokmi koralová útesy



Dažďové palice z kaktusov

Veľmi známe suveníry sú dažďové palice, čo sú vlastne dlhé kmene kaktusov naplnené semenami, ktoré ak sa o seba udierajú, vydávajú zvuk dažďa.



Kože plazov

Kabelky, topánky, peňaženky a pod. môžu byť vyrobené z koží jašterov, hadov alebo z krokodílov. Dovoz týchto výrobkov je predmetom licencie a povolenia na dovoz



Šperky a panciere korytnačiek morských

Šperky, spony do vlasov a slnečné okuliare sú často vyrábané z pancierov morských korytnačiek. Dovoz takýchto výrobkov je zakázaný. Tento zákaz sa vzťahuje aj na vypreparované korytnačky, ktoré sú ilegálne predávané napríklad na tropických plážach Juhovýchodnej Ázie.





Kaviár

Dovoz všetkých druhov jeseterov a ich kaviáru je sledovaný a kontrolovaný. Dovážať sa môže najviac 125 gramov kaviáru na osobu bez dovozného



Šatky vyrobené z vlny tibetskej antilopy

Na výrobu jednej šatky zo šatušu (Perzský výraz "shahtoosh", ktorý znamená "potešenie kráľov") je potrebné, aby pytliak zabil tri tibetské antilopy. Šatky zo šatušu sa predávajú najmä v Indii. Vlnu z kriticky ohrozenej tibetskej antilopy je do Európskej únie zakázané dovážať.
