Additional comments	The Trade in Species of Fauna and Flora Regulations, 2004, provide that the Scientific Authority and the Management Authority shall advise the Minister for the Environment to prohibit the trade (import, export and re-export) and the possession of any species of flora and fauna if in their joint opinion, or in the individual opinion of either of the Authorities, such trade or possession would endanger the biological identity or any ecosystem or any species of flora and fauna.
	These Regulations also provide that it is the responsibility of the person who is seeking to import or is in possession of any live specimen to obtain the necessary information from the Management Authority.
	Any person who would like to import live specimens of fauna (of CITES and non-CITES species) from outside the European Community requires the prior grant of an import licence that is issued by the Trade Services Directorate. This import licence is granted if the Management Authority, following consultation with the Scientific Authority, does not have any objection to the importation.
	The Regulations also specify that any person who has in his/her possession any specimen the import of which is subject to these regulations shall retain in his/her possession and for such time as that specimen remains in his/her possession, all permits, certificates and licences relative to the import of that specimen.

The person involved was on his way back from a hunting trip in Argentina via Frankfurt, and had no supporting CITES documentation.

In addition to the 119 CITES-listed bird carcasses, the importer had various other bird skins, amounting to more than 400 specimens in total.

Follow up inspections by the Wild Birds Regulation Unit revealed that the said importer was also in possession of 55 taxidermy CITES-listed specimens in his private collection, including eagles, herons, kites, buzzards, falcons, bustards, kestrels, an osprey, owls, etc.

The importer was arraigned and the case is sub judice.
