Review of Significant Trade in specimens of Appendix-II species

### OVERVIEW OF THE REVIEW OF SIGNIFICANT TRADE

- 1. This document has been prepared by the Secretariat.
- 2. In Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18) on Review of Significant Trade in specimens of Appendix-II species, the Conference of the Parties:
  - 5. DIRECTS the Secretariat, for the purpose of monitoring and facilitating the implementation of this Resolution and the relevant paragraphs of Article IV:
    - a) to report at each meeting of the Animals or Plants Committee on the implementation by the range States concerned of the recommendations made by the Committee; and
    - b) to maintain a database of species/country combinations that are included in the review process set out in this Resolution including a record of progress with the implementation of recommendations; Implementation by range States of recommendations made by the Animals Committee.
- 3. The last update of the status of the Review of Significant Trade (RST) for fauna species was reported to the Animals Committee at its 31st meeting (AC31, online, June 2021; see document <u>AC31 Doc. 13.1</u>).

## Updates since AC31

#### Decisions taken at SC74

- 4. At its 74th meeting (SC74, Lyon, March 2022), the Standing Committee agreed to lift the current recommendation to suspend trade for *Macaca fascicularis* / Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR), and to remove the species/country combination from the Review of Significant Trade process, subject to the publication of zero export quotas for specimens of source codes W, F and R. These quotas were confirmed by Lao PDR and published on 30 March 2022. Should Lao PDR wish to resume trade under any of these source codes, it must communicate this to the Secretariat and the Chair of the Animals Committee along with a justification [including a non-detriment finding (NDF)], for their agreement (see <a href="SC74 Summary Record">SC74 Summary Record</a>).
- At SC74, the Committee also reviewed 14 fauna cases that were ongoing but not subject to a recommendation to suspend trade (see document <u>SC74 Doc. 30.1</u>). The recommendations of the Committee relating to these cases are summarised below and can be found in full in the <u>SC74 Summary</u> Record.
- 6. The Standing Committee agreed to retain the following species/country combinations: *Amazona farinosa* and *Ara chloropterus* / Guyana; *Poicephalus gulielmi* / Democratic Republic of the Congo; and *Cuora amboinensis* / Indonesia. The Committee urged the range States concerned to provide updates on the

- implementation of outstanding recommendations no later than three months before the documentation deadline for its 77th meeting (SC77, Geneva, November 2023).
- 7. The Standing Committee also agreed to retain the following species/country combinations and requested the Secretariat to <u>publish zero quotas</u>: *Amazona festiva*¹ and *Chelonoidis denticulatus* / Guyana; *Amazona farinosa*, *Ara ararauna* and *Ara chloropterus* / Suriname; and *Uromastyx geyri* / Mali for source codes W, F and R. The Committee urged the range States concerned to provide additional information to justify a higher quota (including an NDF) to be agreed with the AC Chair and updates on the implementation of outstanding recommendations no later than three months before the documentation deadline for SC77.
- 8. The Standing Committee agreed to retain the following cases and reconsider them at its 75th meeting (SC75, Panama City, November 2022): *Ara ararauna |* Guyana and *Anguilla anguilla |* Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia. The Committee also requested Guyana to share the results of its population study of psittacines and provide information on the implementation of the outstanding recommendations no later than three months before the documentation deadline for SC77. For *Anguilla anguilla |* Algeria, the Committee invited Algeria to submit the scientific justification for the proposed increase in quota. For *Anguilla anguilla |* Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia, the Committee requested the Secretariat to produce a detailed summary of the information provided by all three range States for review by the Animals Committee and the IUCN Anguillid Eel Specialist Group, to be further considered by SC75.
- 9. In addition to the review of ongoing cases, and in compliance with paragraph 1 p) of Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18) for cases where the trade suspension had been in place for more than two years, the Standing Committee reviewed 19 fauna species/range State combinations that have been subject to long standing trade suspensions (see document <a href="SC74">SC74</a> Doc. 30.2). Due to limited available resources, the Secretariat focused on those cases that were not reviewed at SC70 (see document <a href="SC70">SC70</a> Doc. 29.2 and <a href="Annex 2">Annex 2</a>) and had been subject to a recommendation to suspend trade since 2016.
  - a) The recommendations to suspend trade were removed, subject to the publication of a zero export quota on the CITES website, for: *Plerogyra simplex and P. sinuosa /* Fiji; and *Kinyongia fischeri* and *K. tavetana /* United Republic of Tanzania, recalling the provisions of paragraph k) i) of Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18) that in such circumstances any change to the quota should be communicated to the Secretariat and the Chair of the relevant Committee along with a justification (including an NDF), for their agreement;
  - b) The recommendations to suspend trade were retained for the following species/country combinations.

#### Decisions taken at CoP19

10. At the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties (CoP19, Panama City, 2022), Parties adopted changes to the *Tridacna* nomenclatural references, such that *Tridacna ningaloo* is no longer recognized as a separate species, but as a synonym of *T. noae*. The RST-related suspensions of trade in *Tridacna* spp. from Solomon Islands have therefore been amended to reflect this, and the list of suspensions updated on the <u>CITES website</u> accordingly.

#### Decisions taken at SC75

- 11. At its 75th meeting (SC75, Panama City, November 2022), the Standing Committee reviewed four fauna cases, as outlined in paragraph 8 (see document <a href="SC75 Doc.8">SC75 Doc.8</a>). All four species/range State combinations were retained within the review: *Ara ararauna* / Guyana and *Anguilla anguilla* / Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia. The recommendations of the Committee as found in the SC75 Summary Record are provided below.
- 12. Concerning Guyana / Ara ararauna, the Standing Committee: i) welcomed the progress made by Guyana in undertaking this study; ii) invited Guyana to clarify how the data from the survey was used to determine the sustainable level of offtake and the proposed export quota; and address the concerns by the Animals Committee in its review of the study (see Annex 2 to document SC75 Doc. 8); and iii) invited Guyana to submit a new non-detriment finding, based on survey data, for review by the Animals Committee, three months before the documentation deadline for SC77.
- 13. Concerning Algeria / Anguilla anguilla, the Standing Committee: i) instructed Algeria to maintain its current annual export quota for A. anguilla of 8,000 kg wild-taken adult eels and 0 glass eels, until it provides a justification for any revised quota, demonstrating how the change is conservative, based on estimates of sustainable off-take that make use of best available scientific information, to the Secretariat and the Chair of the Animals Committee, for their agreement; ii) agreed that recommendations e) and f) have been implemented; iii) commended Algeria for the progress made to date in implementing the remaining recommendations d) and g) to l); and iv) invited Algeria to provide an update on the implementation of the outstanding recommendations three months before the documentation deadline for SC77.
- 14. Concerning Morocco / Anguilla anguilla, the Standing Committee: i) commended Morocco for the considerable progress it has made and the measures it has put in place to manage the species and ensure a strong traceability system is in place; ii) instructed Morocco to maintain its current quotas of 500,000 kg of live adult eels [raised in aquaculture based on a harvest of 2t of glass eels], 5,500 kg of wild-taken adult eels and 0 live glass eel [fingerlings] of A. anguilla until it provides a justification for any increased quota, demonstrating how the change is conservative, based on estimates of sustainable off-take that make use of best available scientific information, to the Secretariat and the Chair of the Animals Committee, for their agreement. In this regard, Morocco should clarify how the proposed increase in the harvest quota for glass eels of 2 tonnes to 4 tonnes will only yield an additional 100 tonnes of adult eels from the farms and share the results of its stock assessment studies when they become available; iii) invited Morocco to provide an update on the implementation of the outstanding recommendations three months before the documentation deadline for SC77; and iv) noted the concerns raised by the North American region and requested the Secretariat to follow up on these concerns.
- 15. Concerning Tunisia / Anguilla anguilla, the Standing Committee: i) commended Tunisia for the considerable progress made to date in implementing recommendations c) to l); ii) instructed Tunisia to maintain its current quota for A. anguilla of 90,000 kg of eels, where export is restricted to specimens greater than 30cm in length and 0 glass eels, until it provides a justification for any increased quota, demonstrating how the change is conservative, based on estimates of sustainable off-take that make use of best available scientific information, to the Secretariat and the Chair of the Animals Committee, for their agreement; and iii) invited Tunisia to provide an update on the implementation of the outstanding recommendations three months before the documentation deadline for SC77.
- 16. The most recent list of range States under a recommendation to suspend trade for certain species included within the Review of Significant Trade process, and following non-compliance with Article IV of the Convention, was published in Notification to the Parties No. <a href="2023/034">2023/034</a> of 23 March 2023. The recommendations and decisions were made in accordance with Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18), Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP17), or Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP13), or its predecessor Resolution Conf. 8.9 (Rev.). The cases involving a suspension of trade are kept under regular review by the Standing Committee in line with paragraph 1 p) of Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18).

17. Annex 1 to the present document provides an updated overview of all fauna cases (species/range State combinations) since the 31st meeting of the Animals Committee, with an indication of their current status under the review process, and the reference documents that provide detailed information for the cases in question. Annex 2 presents a summary table of all fauna range State/species combinations subject to a recommendation to suspend trade under RST or for which the review process is currently ongoing.

## Decisions 17.108 (Rev. CoP19) to 17.110 (Rev. CoP19) on Review of Significant Trade

18. At its 19th meeting (CoP19, Panama City, 2022), the Conference of the Parties revised Decisions 17.108 (Rev. CoP19) to 17.110 (Rev. CoP19) on *Review of Significant Trade*, as follows:

### Directed to the Secretariat

- **17.108 (Rev. CoP19)** The Secretariat, within six months of the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties and building on the work done to date, shall develop, test and establish a Review of Significant Trade Tracking and Management database as an essential tool for the effective implementation and transparency of the process.
- **17.109 (Rev. CoP19)** The Secretariat, subject to the availability of funds, within six months of the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties, shall develop a user-friendly guide to the Review of Significant Trade that can also be included in the initial letter to range States.
- **17.110 (Rev. CoP19)** The Secretariat, subject to the availability of funds, within nine months of the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties, shall develop a comprehensive training module on the Review of Significant Trade (including case studies as appropriate).
- 19. At the 31st meeting of the Animals Committee (AC31, online, June 2021) and 25th meeting of the Plants Committee (PC25, online, June 2021), the Secretariat informed the Committees that the United Nations International Computing Centre had finalised the Review of Significant Trade (RST) Tracking and Management System in October 2020 and had been contracted to undertake the system's maintenance. The Secretariat further informed that the United Nations Environment Programme World Conservation Monitoring Centre (UNEP-WCMC) had been contracted to populate the RST Tracking and Management System with the relevant documentation for all current RST cases (i.e., ongoing cases and those species/country combinations subject to a recommendation to suspend trade).
- At a side event during CoP19, the Secretariat launched the RST Tracking and Management System making it publicly available to all CITES Parties and interested stakeholders. Accordingly, Decision 17.108 (Rev. CoP19) has been fully implemented.
- 21. In parallel, the Secretariat has worked with UNEP-WCMC to implement Decisions 17.109 (Rev. CoP19) and 17.110 (Rev. CoP19). In implementation of Decision 17.109 (Rev.CoP19), the Secretariat has made available a draft user-friendly guide for all public users of the RST Tracking and Management System, through Notification to the Parties No. 2023/022 of 2 March 2023. The Notification invited Parties to provide feedback on the Tracking and Management System and the draft user manual by 30 April 2023. A comprehensive training module in the form of a video tutorial is expected to be soon made available to all Parties and interested stakeholders in implementation of Decision 17.109 (Rev. CoP19).

## Recommendation

22. The Animals Committee is invited to take note of this document.
