Financial support for the Sponsored Delegates Project

Provision of support under the Sponsored Delegates Project

- 4. The selection criteria are based on the following:
 - Human Development Index (HDI) ranking from highest to lowest
 - Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and/or Small Island Development States (SIDS)
 - Parties with less than six delegates at the previous meeting of the Conference of the Parties
 - Standing Committee member
 - Being on the agenda for SC75 (compliance matters, Article XIII and NIAP)
 - Submission of an amendment proposal for CoP19
- 5. One-hundred-one Party delegates from 67 Parties were funded by the Sponsored Delegates Project to attend CoP19, of which 97 Party delegates were fully funded and four Party delegates partially funded, as shown in Annex 1 to this document. Twenty-four per cent of the Party delegates funded are female. All Parties that have sponsored delegates have had their credentials accepted, except for Equatorial Guinea, Rwanda and Somalia.

Funding received by delegates to attend CoP19 outside the Sponsored Delegates Project

6. In addition to the 101 delegates supported under the SPD, the CITES Secretariat provided support to seventeen participants in Panama to also attend the 4th Global Meeting of the Wildlife Enforcement Networks (WENs), convened by the CITES Secretariat on behalf of the International Consortium on Combating Wildlife Crime (ICCWC), with the generous support of the United States of America.
