Review of Significant Trade in specimens of Appendix-II species

OVERVIEW

1. This document has been prepared by the Secretariat.

Background

- 2. The role and responsibilities of the Standing Committee in conducting the Review of Significant Trade (RST) in specimens of Appendix-II species are described in paragraph 1 k) to p) and paragraph 2 of Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18) on *Review of Significant Trade in specimens of Appendix-II species*.
- 3. This document provides an update since the last overview of cases subject to review under Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18) presented at the 77th meeting of the Standing Committee (SC77; Geneva, November 2023).
- 4. Details of the 91 cases (species or taxa/country or range State combinations) that are currently in the RST are presented in the Annex to this document. Of these cases, 67 relate to fauna and 24 relate to flora. It includes the 11 species/country combinations that were retained in Stage 3 of the RST process by the Plants Committee (see summary record <u>PC27 SR</u>) and the 20 species/country combinations retained by the Animals Committee (see summary record <u>AC33 SR</u>) at their 27th and 33rd meetings respectively (PC27 and AC33; Geneva, July 2024).
- 5. In document SC78 Doc. 34.3, the Secretariat submitted for consideration of the Standing Committee its determination of implementation of flora cases that are due for reporting at the present meeting or for which there are updates since their retention in Stage 3 of the process at PC27. The determination of implementation of *Pterocarpus erinaceus* as an exceptional case for the eight range States concerned is reported on in document SC78 Doc. 33.3. The recommendations of both documents reflect the outcomes of the consultations with the Plants Committee at its 27th meeting (PC27; Geneva, July 2024), in accordance with paragraph 1 k) of Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18).
- 6. In document SC78 Doc. 34.2, the Secretariat has submitted for consideration of the Standing Committee its determination of implementation of fauna cases that are due for reporting at the present meeting. The recommendations of said document reflect the outcomes of the intersessional consultations with the Animals Committee, in accordance with paragraph 1 k) of Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18).

Updates on flora species/country combinations since SC77

7. At SC77, the Secretariat reported in document <u>SC77 Doc. 35.3</u> on the actions taken by Parties to implement the recommendations made by the Plants and Standing Committees under RST to ensure compliance with the obligations of Article IV, paragraph 2 (a), 3 or 6 (a) of the Convention. The Secretariat informed the Standing Committee of its determination as to whether the recommendations formulated by the Plants Committee had been implemented by the range States concerned.

- 8. The recommendations of the Standing Committee are found in summary record <u>SC77 SR</u> and summarized below. The Committee agreed to retain the following species/country combinations:
 - a) Dalbergia retusa / Nicaragua.
 - b) Pericopsis elata / Congo.
- 9. The Committee also agreed that the following species/country combinations be removed from the process:
 - a) Dalbergia retusa / Panama.
 - b) Pericopsis elata / Democratic Republic of the Congo.
 - c) Prunus africana / Cameroon.
 - d) Prunus africana / Democratic Republic of the Congo.
 - e) Pterocarpus santalinus / India.
- 10. At SC77, the Standing Committee also considered progress on the eight ongoing *Pterocarpus erinaceus* RST cases, as reported in document <u>SC77 Doc. 33.2.3</u>. Likewise, at PC27, the Plants Committee considered progress on each of these cases through document <u>PC27 Doc. 15.3</u>. Updates on the outcomes of SC77 and PC27 are reported at the present meeting in document SC78 Doc. 33.2 on the *Expedited application of Article XIII for West African rosewood (Pterocarpus erinaceus) for all range States.*
- At PC27, the Plants Committee considered progress in the implementation of recommendations for species selected following CoP17, through document <u>PC27 Doc. 15.2</u>. Progress on the two cases concerned (Congo / *Pericopsis elata* and Nigeria / *Dalbergia retusa*) is reported at the present meeting in document SC78 Doc. 34.3 on *Implementation of recommendations of the Plants Committee*.
- 12. At PC27, the Plants Committee also reviewed species selected following CoP19, which included the available information on the taxa that were selected at PC26, responses received from the range States concerned in accordance with paragraph f) of Resolution Conf. 12.8 (Rev. CoP18) and a report compiled by the United Nations Environment Programme World Conservation Monitoring Centre (UNEP-WCMC) about the biology, management and trade in the species selected. In instances where the Committee was satisfied that Article IV, paragraphs 2 (a), 3 or 6 (a), were correctly implemented, the species was eliminated from the Review with respect to the range State concerned, and these range States were notified accordingly by the Secretariat (see document PC27 Doc. 15.4 and summary record PC27 SR).
- The taxa and countries that were selected following CoP19 and retained in the Review at PC27 are shown in Table 1 below. The Plants Committee formulated recommendations for each species/country combination as contained in Annex 1 to summary record <u>PC27 SR</u> and in the <u>Review of Significant Trade Tracking and</u> <u>Management database</u>.

14. Following PC27, the Secretariat wrote to all range States retained in the Review to inform them that the species/country had been retained in the RST and forwarded the recommendations made by the Plants Committee. The Secretariat also took the opportunity to draw attention to the new CITES guidance on non-detriment finding (NDF) developed under Decision 19.132, which is available on the page on <u>non-detriment findings</u> on the CITES website.

Updates on fauna species/country combinations since SC77

- 15. At SC77, the Secretariat reported in document <u>SC77 Doc. 35.2 (Rev. 1)</u> on actions taken by Parties to implement the recommendations made by the Animals and Standing Committees under RST to ensure compliance with the obligations of Article IV, paragraph 2 (a), 3 or 6 (a) of the Convention. The Secretariat informed the Standing Committee of its determination as to whether the recommendations formulated by the Animals Committee had been implemented by the range States concerned.
- 16. The recommendations of the Standing Committee are found in summary record <u>SC77 SR</u> and summarized below. The Committee agreed to retain the following species/country combinations:
 - a) Chelonoidis denticulatus / Suriname;
 - b) Notochelys platynota / Indonesia: invited to publish an annual export quota from 2024 of 250 specimens of Notochelys platynota with a maximum straight carapace length (SCL) of 15 cm;
 - c) Strombus gigas / Grenada;
 - d) Amazona farinosa / Suriname: annual export quota of 200 specimens;
 - e) Ara ararauna / Guyana: annual export quota of 660 birds;
 - f) Ara ararauna / Suriname: annual export quota of 500 specimens;
 - g) Ara chloropterus / Suriname: zero annual export quota;
 - h) Poicephalus gulielmi / the Democratic Republic of the Congo;
 - i) Anguilla anguilla / Algeria and Tunisia.
- 17. The Committee also agreed to remove the following species/country combinations:
 - a) *Malayemys subtrijuga* / Indonesia, subject to an export quota of 125 for live individuals, including a maximum straight carapace length (SCL) of 10 cm;
 - b) Trioceros feae / Equatorial Guinea, subject to the publication of a zero annual export quota;
 - c) Trioceros quadricornis / Cameroon, subject to the publication of a zero annual export quota;
 - d) *Cuora amboinensis /* Indonesia, revised export quota of 7,200 specimens from the wild, including a minimum straight carapace length (SCL) of 18 cm;
 - e) Anguilla anguilla / Morocco.
- 18. At AC33, the Animals Committee considered document <u>AC33 Doc. 14.2</u> on six cases where actions were taken by Parties to implement recommendations made by the Animals and Standing Committees since the Secretariat's last report to the Standing Committee at SC77 [see document <u>SC77 Doc. 35.2 (Rev. 1)]</u>. The fauna species/country combinations reviewed in document <u>AC33 Doc. 14.2</u> were: *Pandinus imperator*/Togo (this case was subject to a recommendation to suspend trade); *Chamaeleo gracilis*/Togo; *Notochelys platynota*/Indonesia; *Anguilla anguilla*/Algeria; and *Anguilla anguilla*/Tunisia. The recommendations of the Animals Committee are contained in summary record <u>AC33 SR</u> and in document SC78 Doc. 34.2 on *Implementation of recommendations of the Animals Committee*.
- 19. At AC33, the Animals Committee also considered document <u>AC33 Doc. 14.3 (Rev. 1)</u> which included the available information on 21 animal species/country combinations that were selected at AC32, and responses received from the range States concerned in accordance with paragraph g) of Resolution Conf. 12.8

(Rev. CoP18). The document also contained a report compiled by UNEP-WCMC about the biology, management and trade in the species selected. In instances where the Committee was satisfied that Article IV, paragraphs 2 (a), 3 or 6 (a), were correctly implemented, the species was removed from the Review with respect to the range State concerned, and these range States were notified accordingly by the Secretariat (see summary record <u>AC33 SR</u>).

- 20. Concerning trade in *Falco cherrug*, Jordan confirmed that it does not export falcons at all. They are protected according to its national laws. In addition, Jordan stated that it does not have any facility that breeds falcons, but re-exports specimens imported legally into the country. As a result of the data clarifications provided by Jordan, the Secretariat informed Jordan that it would not be taking *Falco cherrug* from Jordan forward as a priority case in Stage 2 of the RST process.
- 21. The taxa and range States that were selected following CoP19 and retained in the Review at AC33 are shown in Table 2 below. The Animals Committee formulated recommendations for each species/country combination as presented in summary record AC33 SR.

22. On 12 August 2024, the Secretariat wrote to all Parties retained in the Review following AC33 to inform them that the species/country had been retained in the RST and forwarded the recommendations made by the Animals Committee. The Secretariat also took the opportunity to draw attention to the new CITES NDF guidance developed under Decision 19.132, which is available on the page on <u>non-detriment findings</u> on the CITES website.

Progress in the implementation of Decisions 17.108 (Rev. CoP19) to 17.110 (Rev. CoP19) on Review of Significant Trade

23. At CoP19, the Conference of the Parties revised Decisions 17.108 (Rev. CoP19) to 17.110 (Rev. CoP19) on *Review of Significant Trade*, as follows:

Directed to the Secretariat

- **17.108 (Rev. CoP19)** The Secretariat, within six months of the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties and building on the work done to date, shall develop, test and establish a Review of Significant Trade Tracking and Management database as an essential tool for the effective implementation and transparency of the process.
- **17.109 (Rev. CoP19)** The Secretariat, subject to the availability of funds, within six months of the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties, shall develop a user-friendly guide to the Review of Significant Trade that can also be included in the initial letter to range States.

17.110 (Rev. CoP19) The Secretariat, subject to the availability of funds, within nine months of the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties, shall develop a comprehensive training module on the Review of Significant Trade (including case studies as appropriate).

- 24. At SC77, the Standing Committee noted document <u>SC77 Doc. 35.1 (Rev. 1)</u> and agreed that Decisions 17.108 (Rev. CoP19) and 17.109 (Rev. CoP19) have been implemented.
- 25. Concerning the implementation of Decision 17.110 (Rev. CoP19) and the development of a training module on RST, the Secretariat is currently revising the online courses on the CITES Virtual College which includes a specific module on RST. This should be made available in 2025.

Recommendations

- 26. The Standing Committee is invited to:
 - a) note this report;
 - b) encourage Parties subject to the Review of Significant Trade process to volunteer as case studies to be included in the RST module on the CITES Virtual College; and
 - c) agree that Decision 17.110 (Rev. CoP19) can be proposed for deletion at the next meeting of Conference of the Parties, pending the launch of the RST module on the CITES Virtual College.
