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R5.10	<p>RECOMMENDS that for the purposes of Article III, paragraphs 3(c) and 5(c), of the Convention, the following general principles and the examples in the Annex attached to the present Resolution be used by the Parties in assessing whether the importation of a specimen of an Appendix I species would result in its use for "primarily commercial purposes":</p> <p>General Principles</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Trade in Appendix I species must be subject to particularly strict regulation and authorized only in exceptional circumstances. 2. An activity can generally be described as "commercial" if its purpose is to obtain economic benefit, including profit (whether in cash or in kind) and is directed toward resale, exchange, provision of a service or other form of economic use or benefit. 3. The term "commercial purposes" should be defined by the country of import as broadly as possible so that any transaction which is not wholly "non-commercial" will be regarded as "commercial". In transposing this principle to the term "primarily commercial purposes", it is agreed that all uses whose non-commercial aspects do not clearly predominate shall be considered to be primarily commercial in nature with the result that the importation of Appendix I specimens should not be permitted. The burden of proof for showing that the intended use of specimens of Appendix I species is clearly non-commercial shall rest with the person or entity seeking to import such specimens. 4. Article III, paragraphs 3(c) and 5(c), of the Convention concern the intended use of the Appendix I specimen in the country of importation, not the nature of the transaction between the owner of the specimen in the country of export and the recipient in the country of import. It can be assumed that a commercial transaction underlies many of the transfers of Appendix I specimens from the country of export to the country of import. This does not automatically mean, however, that the specimen is to be used for "primarily commercial purposes".
