Interpretation and implementation of the Convention

National reports

LATE OR NON-SUBMISSION OF ANNUAL REPORTS

- 1. This document has been prepared by the Secretariat.
- 2. The Secretariat's table of annual report submissions, which is available on the CITES website, shows that:
 - a) Liberia and Somalia have not provided annual reports for the period 1997-2002;
 - b) Mauritania has not provided annual reports for the period 1999-2002; and
 - c) Algeria, Azerbaijan, Belize, Benin, Burundi, the Central African Republic, Cyprus, Grenada, Guinea-Bissau, Niger, Nigeria, Seychelles, Sri Lanka and Sudan have not provided annual reports for the period 2000-2002.
- 3. Notification to the Parties No. 2002/064 of 19 December 2002, containing a recommendation by the Standing Committee to suspend trade with Liberia and Somalia for the failure to submit annual reports, remains valid. Notification to the Parties No. 2003/027 of 6 May 2003, containing a recommendation by the Standing Committee to suspend trade with Mauritania for the failure to submit annual reports, also remains valid.
- 4. In compliance with Decision 11.89, the Standing Committee shall determine

which Parties have failed, without having provided adequate justification, to provide the annual reports required under Article VIII, paragraph 7 (a), of the Convention for three consecutive years within the deadline established in Resolution Conf. 11.17 (Rev. CoP12), or the extended deadline that is provided for in that Resolution.

Recommendations

- 5. The Secretariat recommends that the Standing Committee, pursuant to Decision 11.89, determine that:
 - a) Liberia and Somalia have failed, without having provided adequate justification, to provide annual reports for the period 1997-2002;
 - b) Mauritania has failed, without having provided adequate justification, to provide annual reports for the period 1999-2002; and

- c) Algeria, Azerbaijan, Belize, Benin, Burundi, the Central African Republic, Cyprus, Grenada, Guinea-Bissau, Niger, Nigeria, Seychelles, Sri Lanka and Sudan have failed, without having provided adequate justification, to provide annual reports for the period 2000-2002.
- 6. It further recommends that the Standing Committee, pursuant to Decision 11.37, instruct the Secretariat to issue a Notification recommending that Parties not authorize any trade in specimens of CITES-listed species with the Parties listed in paragraph 5. c) above until further notice.
