Reports and Recommendations of the Committees

IDENTIFICATION MANUAL COMMITTEE

1. INTRODUCTION

The Chairman of the Identification Manual Committee handed in his resignation during the sixth meeting of the Conference of the Parties and, until now, it has not been possible to find a replacement for him. At the Standing Committee's request, Dr. Dollinger has agreed to continue the programme undertaken until the end of 1989.

The Secretariat is therefore presenting the report in the Chair's absence.

2. GENERAL ACTIVITIES AND ENGLISH EDITION

Document SC 17.6 (*) is attached as Annex 1, and an up-dating of document SC 18.9, which summarizes the Committee's activities since the sixth meeting of the Conference of the Parties, is attached as Annex 2. These documents were presented to the Standing Committee during its 17th and 18th meetings.

3. FRENCH EDITION

More than 500 data sheets have been translated by the Canadian Wildlife Service and have been revised by a consultant for the Secretariat.

The lay-outs for 430 data sheets have been prepared and are ready to be edited.

The Secretariat launched a fund for the French edition. Numerous institutions have given a positive reply.

Moreover, the French and Belgian Governments have provided a subsidy that will enable the first section to be printed.

In spite of technical problems that have arisen at the printer's, the first part of the French edition of the Identification Manual should be available before the end of 1989.

* Annexes A, B and C of document SC 17.6 only give information that is up-dated in Annex 2; they are not reproduced here.

4. SPANISH EDITION

Thanks to EEC financing, almost all of the data sheets in Volume 1 (mammals) have been translated, but a lack of funds means that the translation cannot be continued and the work already translated cannot be printed.

5. The Secretariat wishes to stress to the Parties the importance of the Identification Manual and the absolute necessity of continuing its development. It is therefore essential that a Chairman be appointed during the seventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties and that funds be allocated to this project.
6. The Secretariat wishes to pay particular homage to Dr. Peter Dollinger for the tremendous work that he has carried out.



REPORT ON THE IDENTIFICATION MANUAL

1 Staff situation

During the Ottawa meeting, the Chairman of the ID-Manual Committee (Dr. P. Dollinger, Switzerland) resigned from his functions. The reasons for this step were the following:

a. Inconsistency in the decisions of the COP

Although the COP received a report from the Committee's Chairman, stating that the manuscripts of 237 data sheets had been completed but that these sheets could not be printed due to lack of funds (amount required ca. Sfr. 75'000), that 251 + data sheets are under preparation by the Parties (amount required for printing ca. Sfr. 83'000), that the annual costs for a part-time secretary are about Sfr. 10'000, and that no funds are available to complete the French and to promote the Spanish versions of the Manual, the COP allocated only US\$ 50'000 p.a. to the ID-Manual project.

On the other hand, the COP decided to add 500 new species to the Appendices which will require the production of at least 150 new data sheets plus a revision of the checklist of species, thus increasing the costs of the project by roughly Sfr. 80'000, and several delegations requested also to accelerate the production of the French and Spanish versions.

Through the decisions of the COP the Chairman was placed in the position of being unable to fulfil his tasks as far as the editing of the Manual is concerned.

b. Neglecting of identification problems by the COP

Although Switzerland has formally drawn the attention of the Parties to a number of identification problems which would result from the inclusion of certain new taxa in the Appendices, and although the Committee's Chairman stressed the problem again during the meeting, the COP approved the inclusion of the taxa concerned after some delegations expressed the view that proper identification of specimens in trade was not relevant.

It was rather difficult for the Chairman of the ID-Manual Committee to accept the philosophy behind these decisions of the COP, and it is obvious that, having devoted several thousands of working hours to the problem of identification of species by controlling agents, he felt more than frustrated.

In a meeting of the ID-Manual Committee, no other Committee member volunteered to succeed the former Chairman. Instead, the following decisions were taken:

- a. The Chairmanship of the Committee remains vacant.
- b. The former Chairman will continue to edit the Manual, as far as the restricted funds will allow.
- c. The former Chairman and the Secretariat will negotiate with IUCN whether and under what conditions IUCN would be prepared to function as editor of the Manual.
- d. Once the question of editing is solved, a new Chairman shall be elected by the Committee.

On September 10, the former Chairman met with Steve Edwards from IUCN. The results of their discussions were the following:

- a. IUCN will take over editorial functions only if the new Chairman will be responsible for all contacts with the Management Authorities, i.e. requesting from them the submission of manuscripts, asking for voluntary financial contributions, and submitting progress reports.
- b. CITES will have to reimburse the costs resulting from the editorial work, mainly the salaries for a part-time editor and a part-time secretary.
- c. An estimate of annual editing costs of Sfr. 20'000 would be realistic.

On December 31, Ms. Eva Antonietti, part-time Secretary of the ex-Chairman, resigned from her post. Under the current circumstances it is not possible to replace her.

2 Financial situation

At the time of the Ottawa meeting, there were some unpaid bills from the printer, totalling Sfr. 60'000 for the type-setting of the French and Sfr. 32'147 for the printing of some sections of the English edition. These bills could be paid in the meantime, leaving almost no money in the Secretariat's account.

Therefore, the ex-Chairman tried to raise some funds from Governments and NGO's in order to continue the production of the English edition. Contributions were received in cash from the Governments of FR Germany, Switzerland and Norway and from WWF Switzerland, and in kind (printing of 23 data sheets) from the Government of the North West Territories, Canada.

A forecast of the financial situation of the English edition of the Manual is given as Annex A.

On November 20, the ex-Chairman was informed by the Secretary General, that under the revised budget to be discussed at the SC Meeting at San José, only US\$ 30'000 p.a. will be allocated to the ID-Manual project (instead of 50'000).

The ex-Chairman suggested that, subject to the approval by the SC, only US\$ 12'000 should be allocated to the English edition, while the rest should be used to promote the French version in which already a lot of money has been invested.

A forecast of the financial situation of the French version of the Manual is given as Annex B.

For the Spanish version, no funding is available from the Secretariat's budget. The matter has been discussed with George Furness, who in turn will contact a commercial publisher in the United States.

3 Committee work

As a result of the resignation of the Chairman, all Committee activities have ceased, except for occasional contacts with John Heppes, Canada.

4 Progress report

41 Production of artwork

Since Australia was not in a position to provide the artwork to illustrate their manuscript on birds of Paradise, the ex-Chairman tried to obtain external funding. On October 29, Sfr. 13'200 was received from WWF Switzerland. Mr. U. Woy was contracted to draw the illustrations, and Mr. R.E. Honegger to take care of the scientific supervision of the work. In the meantime, most of the illustrations have been received.

The same artist was also contracted to produce the illustrations for the data sheets on *Varanus caudolineatus*, *glauerti* and *pilbarensis*, also submitted by Australia.


5 Sale of surplus copies of the Manual

REPORT ON THE IDENTIFICATION MANUAL (as of 30 June 1989)

This report is based on document SC 18.9 up dated.

1. Progress Report (English edition)

11. Production of Artwork

Switzerland contracted an artist (U. Iff) to produce three drawings for the illustrations of the Canadian contribution on whale teeth.

12. Submission of Manuscripts

A few data sheet manuscripts were received which related to Ottawa amendments (Anodorhynchus hyacinthinus, Paroaria spp.). These were forwarded to the Secretariat.

The United States of America submitted a manuscript on five Carnivora species (received 16 August 1988).

Canada submitted the manuscript on freshwater dolphins (received 23 February 1988).

Switzerland submitted a manuscript on Orcaella (which was not included in the Canadian contribution).

The Chilean manuscript on Pterocnemia received in 1987 (but not mentioned in the report SC 17.6) was completed.

New manuscripts submitted include Iguanidae spp. (4 sheets) by the Florida State Museum, and Neoceratodus forsteri (1 sheet) submitted by Switzerland. Date of receipt: Iguanidae 12 May, Neoceratodus 25 May.

13. New Sheets under Preparation

Denmark indicated the intent to revise some of the Strigidae sheets.

Switzerland concluded a Sfr 24,000 contract with Honegger/Woy on the preparation of the Boidae section. The Manuscript will be delivered in early 1990.

16. New Binders

The Secretariat ordered 2 x 1000 binders for volumes 1a and 2a which were delivered in January 1989. The production had been sponsored by the Government of Japan.

The balance in the Committee's account will be sufficient to print the few manuscripts which are in the hands of the editor. The contribution of the Federal Republic of Germany on lizard skins was not received in time which means that it could not be edited prior to the 7th meeting of the Conference of the Parties.

Annotations: The balance at 01.01.1988 contained SFr. 3,800 from the Government of Norway which was earmarked for the printing of the Haliaeetus section and SFr. 13,100 from WWF Switzerland which was earmarked for the birds of paradise section. This money was spent for these purposes on 10.03.1988.

In addition the balance contained SFr. 12,000 received from the Government of Switzerland of which SFr. 11,470 was spent on 21.11.1988 for the printing of the Colobinae, Tubulidentata, Bovidae, Struthioniformes, Rallidae, Rhynochetidae, Bucerotidae and Tridacnidae sections.

Finally the balance contained also SFr. 16,200 from the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany also contributed in 1987. Of this amount SFr. 903 was spent on 21.11.1988 for the printing of the Rheiformes section.

The SFr. 3,700 donated by Liechtenstein for the printing of some data sheets on Cervidae was used for this purpose on 21.11.1988, as was the contribution from the Government of Austria and WWF Austria of SFr. 1,600 each for the printing of the Hylobatidae section.

The Government of Japan's contribution of SFr. 25,000 was received via the Secretariat. It was fully used in January 1989 for the printing of the section on Cetacea.
