Transfer of Loxodonta africana from Appendix II to Appendix I

Amendment Proposal

This proposal is submitted by the following Parties:

Botswana
Malawi
Mozambique
Zambia
Zimbabwe

and replaces the amendment proposal in document Doc. 7.43.5.

Transfer of Loxodonta africana from Appendix II to Appendix I, "excluding the populations of Botswana, Malawi, Mozambique, South Africa, Zambia and Zimbabwe; and Namibia and Angola (on accession to CITES), under quotas for export of raw ivory (excepting sport hunting trophies) approved by the Conference of the Parties", and that this exclusion is conditional upon the observance of a moratorium by the named Parties on trade in raw and commercial shipments of worked ivory, but not on other elephant products or sport hunting trophies, until such time as a working group, established at the seventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties and acceptable to the named states, is satisfied that certain criteria are met for the management of their elephant populations, that measures have been applied to control legal trade and to prevent illegal hunting and illegal trade, and that formal confirmation has been received from the named Parties to abide by the recommendations of the Working Group and the decisions of the Conference of the Parties.

Any other Party with Loxodonta africana populations which satisfies biological management and trade control criteria laid down by the Conference of the Parties may, at a future date, be entitled to the same facilities accorded to the named Parties above.
