Transfer of Loxodonta africana from Appendix II to Appendix I.

Amendment Proposal

This proposal is submitted by the following Parties:

Cameroon
Congo
Gabon

Transfer of Loxodonta africana from Appendix II to Appendix I, "excluding the populations of Cameroon, the Congo and Gabon" on the condition that the named countries will observe a moratorium on trade in raw ivory and commercial shipments of worked ivory until such time as a working group, established by the Conference of the Parties and acceptable to the named Parties, is satisfied that satisfactory arrangements have been made for resumption of trade. The named countries will be permitted to export existing stocks of ivory owned by their governments before the inception of the moratorium, after these stocks have been registered by the working group. Thereafter no additional stocks will be exported until the moratorium has been lifted.
