

- "CITES Guidelines for transport and preparation for shipment of live wild animals"
- 1981: made available
- 1981: last revised in
- 2002: determined as out of date at CoP12 in
- 2004: CoP13 directed AC to develop up-todate guidelines to replace 1981 guidelines

- 2007: Revision of Res. Conf. 10.21 at CoP14
- IATA LAR ... be used as a reference ... means other than air ... appropriate!
- 2008: AC23 in established a new TWG
- TWG work on scoping exercise to determine the need for creating new guidelines
- Joint AC/PC TWG



Results

- no need for creating new guidelines
- IATA LAR already meet CITES air transport requirements
- ... used as a reference ... where appropriate!
- "appropriate" conflicts no definition
- LAR as main reference for all forms of transport of CITES-listed species
- identify taxa deviations
- compilation of amended or new sections



CITES Guidelines for the Non-Air Transport of Live Wild Animals and Plants

- addendum to IATA LAR
- 2013: adopted at CoP16 in Bangkok
- into force 12 June, 2013
- LAR basic standard for all modes of transport
- "Introduction"
- "General Conditions"
- "Technical Specifications"



"General Conditions"

- for plants IATA PCR apply
- for animals IATA LAR are appropriate
- for some animal species deviations from the LAR are appropriate too



"General Conditions"

- fitness for transport
- exceptions for injured, sick, ... animals
- planning obligation
- means of transport
- persons accompanying transports
- marking & labelling
- loading & unloading
- during transport



- IATA LAR apply to non-air-transport of all taxa
- "Technical Specifications" may also be followed
- only apply to non-air-transport
- only apply to taxa listed in the "Technical Specifications"

- Ratites / CR24
- Flamingos / CR17
- Storks & Cranes / CR17

- Bears / CR72
- Antelope / CR73
- Buffalo & Cattle Species / CR73
- Deer / CR73
- Elephants / CR71
- Rhinos / CR71
- Hippos / CR74




Deviations from the LAR for:

- Kangaroos & Wallabies / CR83
- Pigs / CR74
- Pinnipeds / CR76
- Tapirs / CR74
- Sheep CR73
- Small Camelids CR73
- Wild Asses & Horses CR73
- Giraffe / CR73A



LAR & Guidelines

- CITES Guidelines for the Non-Air Transport of Live Wild Animals and Plants are an addendum to the LAR
- both must be viewed in context
- it's the shipper's decision
- both are appropriate
- one standard



Review & Amendments

- CITES CoP decided to delegate the authority to regularly review, revise and approve amendments to the SC and the Secretariat
- in consultation with the AC, PC and IATA
- IATA LAPB established a CITES Task Force
- review in cooperation with CITES Secretariat
- drafts circulated among AC/PC, Parties and other stakeholders
- SC to review and approve
