World Heritage affected by illegal trade





Local communities - best protectors of wildlife



You are on the front line of this fight



WARNING FOR TOURIST DO NOT BUY IVORY!

No elephant ivory and its products allowed to export from Thailand. Bringing even one ivory tusk out of the country is illegal.

Import and export of ivory and ivory products are illegal.

Penalty:

1. Imprisonment not exceeding 4 years or a fine up to 40,000 baht or both (Wild Animal Reservation and Protection Act 1992)
2. Imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine up to 20,000 baht or both (Export and Import of Goods Act 1979)
3. Imprisonment not exceeding 10 years or a fine equivalent to 4 times the amount of the price of the goods, including duty, or both (Customs Act 1926)

Thailand does not allow the ivory and ivory products to be imported, exported, or transported.
