

CHEETAH RELATED CONTACTS & RESOURCES

National Carnivore Coordinators (NCCs) are trained officers responsible for coordinating the work of their country's National Conservation Action Plan for Cheetah and African Wild Dogs (NCAP). NCCs are usually based in the wildlife department of their country and work to ensure that the relevant government departments, NGOs and individuals are working together on the activities in the NCAP. In May 2022 there were 14 NCCs working across Africa: Algeria, Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Chad, Ethiopia, Kenya, Namibia, Niger, South Sudan, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe. NCCs may be appointed in other countries in the future.

Regional Cheetah Coordinators (RCCs) coordinate the work of the Africa Range-wide Cheetah Conservation Initiative (CCI) (formerly known as the Range Wide Conservation Program for Cheetah and African Wild Dogs, RWCP). The CCI has been active across Africa in supporting range states to develop and implement Conservation Strategies and Action Plans for cheetahs and African wild dogs, at both the regional and national levels. 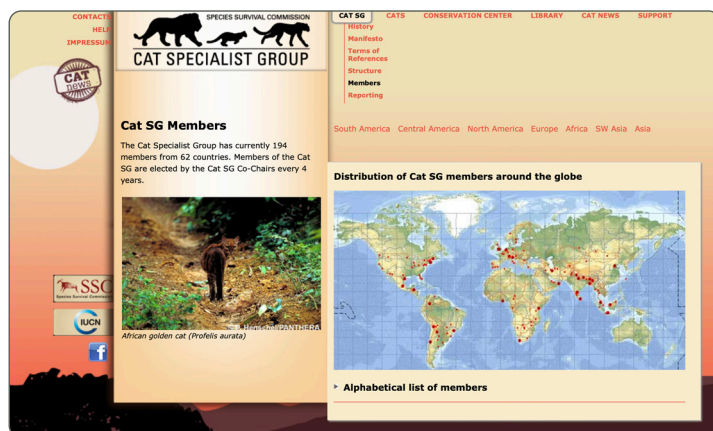
