	E-permitting	

- 1. The CITES Management Authority of Uganda has requested the Secretariat to inform all Parties of the following information concerning CITES permits.
- 2. Uganda has recently developed an online electronic CITES permits application and issuance system. The system was virtually launched on 29 July 2021. The e-permitting system can be accessed at the following address: https://cites.tourism.go.ug/.
- 3. The e-permitting system for Uganda aims to strengthen sustainable wildlife trade through:
 - Promoting paperless, efficient and environmentally friendly transactions;
 - Minimising delays and related inconveniences;
 - Enhancing security features to minimise the potential risk of falsifying permits;
 - Easing the application, licensing and compliance monitoring processes; and
 - Minimising the risk of spreading COVID-19 disease through reduced human interface.
- 4. Uganda will be migrating from the old manual permitting system to the newly launched electronic system for the issuance of import/export/re-export permits effective 1 January 2022. Uganda will fully halt issuance of manual/paper permits effective this date.
