CONCERNING:

PARTIES AFFECTED BY RECOMMENDATIONS TO SUSPEND TRADE UNDER THE REVIEW OF SIGNIFICANT TRADE IN SPECIMENS OF APPENDIX-II SPECIES

Recommendations of the Standing Committee

- In the context of the Review of Significant Trade in specimens of Appendix-II species, the Standing Committee regularly agrees to recommend that trade be suspended with Parties that the Committee determines have failed to implement Article IV of the Convention for certain species. The Secretariat last published the list of countries and species affected by these recommendations with Notification to the Parties No. 2023/034 of 23 March 2023.
- 2. At its 77th meeting (SC77, Geneva, November 2023), the Standing Committee agreed that its recommendations to suspend trade in *Trioceros montium* and *Trioceros quadricornis* from Cameroon and *Trioceros feae* from Equatorial Guinea be withdrawn, subject to the publication of a zero annual export quota. Any change to these quotas should be communicated to the Secretariat and the Chair of the Animals Committee, along with a non-detriment finding, including a justification of how the change is conservative, based on estimates of sustainable off-take that make use of best available scientific information, for their agreement in advance of any trade taking place. In the case of *Trioceros quadricornis* from Cameroon, an update on the implementation of Animal Committee recommendations a) to c) is also required before any resumption of trade [see Annex 1 to document SC77 Doc. 35.2 (Rev. 1)].
- 3. The annual zero export quotas for Cameroon were published on 21 December 2023, therefore the recommendations to suspend trade in *Trioceros montium* and *Trioceros quadricornis* from Cameroon are withdrawn and these species-country combinations removed from the review, subject to the conditions outlined in paragraph 2 above.
- 4. The annual zero export quota for Equatorial Guinea was published on 19 January 2024, therefore the recommendation to suspend trade in *Trioceros feαe* from Equatorial Guinea is withdrawn, and the species-country combination removed from the review, subject to the conditions outlined in paragraph 2 above.
- 5. At SC77, the Standing Committee recommended that all Parties suspend trade in specimens of Uromastyx geyri from Mali until it demonstrates compliance with Article IV, paragraphs 2 (a) and 3, for trade in this species, and provides full information to the Secretariat regarding compliance with the recommendations of the Animals and Standing Committees (see SC77
 Sum. 4).

Secretariat of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES)

- 6. Parties are reminded that the complete list of Parties subject to a recommendation to suspend trade is available on the CITES website under Documents / Trade suspensions.
- 7. Parties are requested to inform their enforcement and customs authorities of the availability of the list of trade suspension recommendations on the CITES website in order to avoid the inadvertent acceptance of specimens of species subject to such a recommendation. Parties that require the issuance of import permits for trade in specimens of Appendix-II species are also encouraged to consult the list when processing applications.
- 8. With regards to the expedited application of Article XIII for *Pterocarpus erinaceus* for all range States and trade suspension recommendations applicable to range States also undergoing RST recommendations, Parties are kindly invited to consult Notification to the Parties No. 2024/006 of 8 January 2024.
- 9. The present Notification replaces Notification to the Parties No. 2023/034 of 23 March 2023.

Recommendations made by the Standing Committee under the Review of Significant Trade only concern trade covered by Article IV of the Convention (i.e. the export, re-export or introduction from the sea of specimens of species included in Appendix II), and not Article VII (the latter including specimens of animal species bred in captivity or of plant species propagated artificially).

The Standing Committee recommended to suspend trade in Calumma spp. and Furcifer spp. from Madagascar, with the exception of Calumma amber, C. ambreense, C. andringitraense, C. boettgeri, C. brevicorne, C. capuroni, C. crypticum, C. cucullatum, C. fallax, C. furcifer, C. gallus, C. gastrotaenia, C. glawi, C. globifer, C. guilbei, C. guillaumeti, C. hafahafa, C. hilleniusi, C. jejy, C. linota, C. malthe, C. marojezense, C. nasutum, C. oshaughnessyi, C. parsonii, C. peltierorum, C. peyrierasi, C. tarzan, C. tsaratananense, C. tsycorne, C. vatosoa, C. vencesi and C. vohibola; and Furcifer angeli, F. antimena, F. balteatus, F. belalandaensis, F. bifidus, F. campani, F. lateralis, F. minor, F. monoceras, F. nicosiai, F. oustaleti, F. pardalis, F. petteri, F. rhinoceratus, F. timoni, F. tuzetae, F. verrucosus and F. willsii.
