<u>Thirty-third meeting of the Animals Committee (AC33):</u>
<u>Registration, documentation and logistics note</u>

#### Date and venue

1. The Secretariat hereby informs Parties that the 33rd meeting of the Animals Committee will be held from Friday 12 (starting at 2pm) to Friday 19 July 2024. On Friday 12 in the afternoon and Saturday 13 July, the meeting will be held jointly with the 27th meeting of the Plants Committee. The meetings will take place at the following address:

# Registration

- 3. All participants must register in advance for this meeting. The participation of women representatives is encouraged. Registration for the meeting is now open and focal points of Parties and observers who attended the 19th meeting of the Conference of the Parties or the 32nd meeting of the Animals Committee should have received an exclusive link for online registration by email. If you have not received an exclusive link, please contact the CITES Secretariat at registration@cites.org. Early registration is recommended for participants who require an entry visa to Switzerland.
- 4. The Secretariat reminds UN agencies and observer bodies or agencies technically qualified in protection, conservation or management of wild fauna and flora that, according to Rules 3 and 4 of the Rules of Procedure, they need to register by **12 June 2024** for AC33.
- 5. The Secretariat further reminds Parties that, according to Rule 2 of the Rules of Procedure, they need to register by **5 July 2024** for AC33.

### Visas to Switzerland

6. The Secretariat reminds Parties and organizations that their representatives may require visas. A visa assistance letter will be sent automatically to all participants whose nomination has been validated. The Secretariat reminds Parties and organizations that such letters will be sent only after it has received an official nomination letter.

#### Financial assistance

7. The Secretariat is unable to provide any financial assistance for participants other than for Members of the Animals Committee from developing countries.

#### **Documentation**

- 9. Parties and Members of the Committee, as well as observers as the request of the Chair of the Committee, may submit working documents for discussion at the meeting in accordance with Rule 10 of the Rules of Procedure of the Animals Committee. These documents must be provided to the Secretariat at least 60 days before the meeting, i.e., by Monday 13 May 2024. Documents received after this date cannot be translated. Documents submitted should not exceed 12 pages and use the template available here.
- 10. Working documents for the meeting will be placed on the CITES website as they become available.
- 11. Documents may be submitted at any time for information purposes in accordance with Rule 11 of the Rules of Procedure. Information documents submitted by the Secretariat, Members and Parties will be made available as submitted and will be included in the list of official documentation.
