Some final input had been given on the draft by technical agencies and experts in October 2003. Delays in finalising the text had arisen due to manpower limitations and other priority legislative demands. It is fully expected that the law will be reviewed by Cabinet of Ministers, given consideration by the House of Parliament and then gazetted during the first quarter of 2004. Brief description of contents: Sections included: preliminary, regulation of international trade, administrative bodies, registration, exemptions, offences and penalties, enforcement and miscellaneous. Legislation is not enacted.

	<p>Comments (general to date):</p> <p>Saint Lucia benefited from the increased publicity which the hosting of the Regional CITES Training Workshop brought. Significant press coverage was undertaken prior to and following the event.</p> <p>Saint Lucia is up to date on the submission of its annual reports, with its 2005 report due before October 31, 2006. The report for 2005 will be compiled by the Department of Forestry, as part of a new alternate reporting procedure between the two Scientific Authorities.</p> <p>Biennial reports on legislative, regulatory and administrative measures are also required. A review undertaken by the Secretariat and considered at COP12 showed that, for the 1990 – 2001 period, Saint Lucia was one of the few</p>		

Caribbean Islands that had occasionally included information on such measures within their annual reports, but generally Parties of the sub-region have not been submitting individual biennial reports. Information on legislative, regulatory and administrative measures, however, has been included within recent sub-regional reports to the Standing Committee for Saint Lucia and other countries.

In late 2001, Saint Lucia initiated a process for the preparation of national enabling legislation for CITES. This process has involved multiple agencies and individuals in Saint Lucia, including the office of the Attorney General. Saint Lucia has also received substantial technical support from the CITES Secretariat.

In spite of a few set-backs often beyond the control of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (Management Authority), which have been communicated to the Secretariat, there was optimism that the legislation would be finalised by the stipulated deadline of December 31, 2005. In this regard, the final set of comments from the Secretariat and the Management Authority were submitted to Saint Lucia's Legislative Drafting Unit on August 25, 2005. The Management Authority was subsequently informed by the aforementioned Unit that a new and improved drafting style is mandated for all new legislation in Saint Lucia, which includes the draft CITES legislation. The first draft was subsequently completed and Saint Lucia now had a newly formatted draft CITES Act and Regulations, which needed to be reviewed. This version was circulated to all parties, including the Secretariat on October 6, 2005, following receipt by the Legislative Drafting Unit. It was substantially different from the format of the previous version and in addition, while the intention of the Drafting Unit was for formatting changes only, content changes had inadvertently been made.

Therefore, Saint Lucia's legislation could not be finalised by the December 31, 2005 deadline. Few comments had been forthcoming from reviewing parties, and the situation was compounded by the fact that both of the officers from the Department of Fisheries who had been coordinating the legislative process were not available, with one of these officers returning to office in March, 2006.

With regards to the foregoing, the Secretariat was written, requesting an eight-month extension following December 31, 2005, that is, up to August 2006. Saint Lucia is committed to the process and is now in the final stages of its new Act, which will be forwarded to the Secretariat for input shortly. Work has already begun on the Regulations, but in the

	interim, it is hoped that the Act will be enacted shortly.
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
