The project reviewed the current trade, conservation status and distribution of Galanthus krasnovii, Galanthis woronowii and Cyclame coum in georgia. Field research, literature and workshop reviews were carried out by experts from the CITES Authority of Georgia, the Royal Botanic Gardens Kew, UK and Microsoft Research, Cambridge, UK. Based on the results of this project the CITES Scientific Authority of Georgia made CITES non-detriment findings for Cyclamen coum (implemented through an annual quota of 500 000 tubers), Galanthus krasnovii (export banned) and galanthus woronowii (implemented through an annual quota of 15 million bulbs with conditions on collection and management regimes). The Managament authority is implementing these controls with ongoing advice and participation of the Scientific Authority.
